STAR Bond Update

The City is excited to announce that the development agreement and project plan for the Goddard Star Bond have been approved. The first phase of this project is expected to invest \$70.8 million into the City of Goddard. The City will be investing \$1.25 million into public infrastructure, additionally \$44.15 million will be invested from private equity, and \$25.4 million will come from the State of Kansas

Phase I of the STAR Bond includes a hotel, competitive swimming facility, and baseball fields. This new development is estimated to bring the City an additional \$378,000 annually in property taxes.

Construction of the STAR bond will generate 318 construction jobs, and 528 indirect jobs. It is expected that the natatorium and baseball fields will bring 262,500 visitors into Goddard. The hotel and conference center will a ttract 35,000 guests.

The \$25.4 million STAR Bond portion of the development will be paid through sales tax revenues within the district. Only sales taxes collected within the district will be used in reimbursing the STAR bonds; this includes taxes from the community improvement district and transient guest tax. The first phase is anticipated to be completed before January 2017.
