Flood Safety Tips

As the weather turns warmer and we enter rainy season, here are a few ways to stay safe this Spring:

1. Do not walk through flowing water. Six inches of moving water is enough to knock you off your feet.
2. Do not drive through a flooded area. Two feet of water will carry away most cars.
3. Stay away from downed power lines and from electrical lines in your own home. Electrical current can travel through water.
4. Watch for animals and snakes. Small animals that have been flooded out of their homes may seek shelter in yours.
5. Watch your step! After a flood, the ground is covered with debris including broken glass and other sharp objects below the mud. Wet or muddy steps can be slippery.
6. Use a flashlight to check for gas leaks. Don't use candles or smoke until you are certain there are no leaks.
7. Have an evacuation plan for yourself and your family members.
8. Prepare an emergency kit in a portable container.


