After conducting a nationwide search, the City of Goddard has chosen Fred Farris of the Lenexa Police Department to serve as the next police chief. Mr. Farris has more than 27 years of law enforcement experience, having served the citizens of Kansas City, Missouri and Lenexa, Kansas.

Mr. Farris has previously served as a tactical unit supervisor (SWAT), patrol sergeant, patrol supervisor, training supervisor, detective sergeant, and FBI Task Force Officer. He holds a bachelor's degree from Park University and is a Certified Public Manager from the University of Kansas. Mr. Farris will begin serving the residents of Goddard during the first week in August.
